Landfill Fees*

These fees apply to garbage (normal household waste), large items (furniture, toys, bikes, grills, stoves, washers, dryers, and small appliances) and demolition/ construction (wood, drywall, doors, flooring, windows, sinks, and roofing). Other materials such as brush, yard waste, tires, microwaves, and Freon containing appliances (air conditioners, dehumidifiers, and refrigerators) have different fees. Residential Waste: \$120/ton Trailers, Cargo Van, UHAULS, Businesses (Including Landlords): \$15 service fee + \$63/ton by weight


Only people authorized by site attendants may utilize the landfill facility. You must provide your own labor for unloading materials. Due to safety concerns, we do not permit salvaging once waste is placed into containers.

The Landfill's address is 3240 Berlin Drive. The diagram to the right illustrates the entrance to our facility (the landfill is the second right on Berlin Drive). The landfill entrance is equipped with inbound and outbound scales - all landfill customers must scale in and out. Department staff are available at the scale to direct you on disposal options and collection of payment.

NEW INFORMATION! PLEASE READ AND SAVE.

SPRING & FALL LARGE ITEM DROP-OFF (☐ on calendar)

Mark your calendar for April 18 and October 3, 2020. On these dates you may bring large items to the Town Hall from 8:30 am to 12:30 pm.

PLEASE REMEMBER: If all available dumpsters are filled prior to the 12:30 pm closing time, we will not accept your items.

The attendant posted by the gate will direct traffic so that only a few vehicles are allowed to unload at a time. You will be expected to unload your items and exit using the back way for efficient traffic flow.

• These items ARE acceptable:

batteries metal objects wire fencing tin, wire, etc. extnsion cords furniture doors/windows lawn furniture water heaters Christmas lights mattresses (+\$15) box springs (+\$15) bathroom fixtures carpeting

These items ARE NOT acceptable:

- Demolition materials (such as shingles) or construction materials: arrange privately for disposal of demolition or construction materials.
- Items with tires on them such as lawn mowers or bicycles: remove the tires. Then you may drop the items off.
- Gas tanks, LP tanks, or sealed containers: you may drop these items off if you punch holes in the bottom.
- Tar or paint cans that still contain liquid tar or paint: Take to HHM La Crosse (See outside of brochure). If cans are dry, you may drop off.
- Appliances, televisions, computers and other electronic **devices:** Have the appliance dealer take the old appliance when delivering the new one or call Harter's (608-782-2082) for a small fee, or contact Runde Metal Recycling 608-526-9358, or you may choose other recycling options. Consult your Yellow Pages.
- Tires, Take tires to the La Crosse County Landfill (see outside of brochure). Fees may apply.

2019-2020 CHRISTMAS TREE DISPOSAL

A dumpster will be available at the rear of the Town Hall from December 27, 2019, to January 10, 2020, for Christmas tree disposal. Please remove tinsel and plastic tree bags before placing the tree in the dumpster.

BURNING - NO BURN BARRELS ALLOWED

BURNING WITHOUT A **ALL BURNING REQUIRES A PERMIT**, including bonfires and burning of grass and brush. All burning is governed by ordinances established by the DNR, the state, and the town.

BURNING PERMITS ARE GOOD FOR 5 DAYS ONLY

Burning guidelines:

 Burn brush and yard waste during the winter months when there is snow cover or in early spring when the ground is still wet, small burn piles, call non-emergence phone number on permit before and after burn. Please be repectful of neighbors.

If the fire department is called to investigate a fire you set for which you did not obtain a permit, you will be charged for the fire call as stated in Town Ordinance 2.02, Sect. 13: 13.2 The penalty for violation of any portion of the ordinance shall be a forfeiture of not less than twenty-five dollars (\$25) or more than two hundred fifty dollars (\$250) plus the cost of prosecution. Penalties are doubled for second and subsequent offenses.



WINTER TIPS

- Clearing snow after each snowfall will make it easier to move your cart to its collection point
- Clear a path from your storage location to your collection point
- Clear a path at your collection point so carts sit flat
- Carts will NOT be collected if placed on a snow bank
- Do not place in gutter/street

REASONS FOR MISSED COLLECTION

- Cart is not placed following the above guidelines.
- Cart is placed out after the designated collection time.
- · Garbage outside of the cart. Overfilled-Lid needs to be
- Placed on a snow bank.
- Contains unacceptable items such as appliances, electronics, hazardous waste, etc.

Curbside Trash Pickup Guidelines

Trash pickup dates: Pickup service is on Thursdays by Harter's Quick Clean-Up (782-2082) unless otherwise indicated on the schedule.

Recycling pickup dates: Pickup is picked up every other week, please refer to the map and calendar for your specific schedule.

Preparing Trash, Placement Tips

Placement Tips

- Make sure the arrows on the lid are pointing towards the road.
- Cart needs to be at least three (3) feet from any fixed objects such as mailboxes, trees, streetlights, or parked vehicles, and with a 3 foot gap between carts.
- Place them at the end of your driveway if possible, or alongside the road.
- If carts on are blocked by cars, we are unable to pick them up, so please be sure to park accordingly.
- Position the cart on as level of a surface as possible.
- Lids need to be closed.
- Place heavier bags/items at the bottom of your cart, to help all items fall out freely.

Set-out Time

- Carts should be placed out by 5 a.m.
- Don't set out more than 12-hrs before day of collection.
- Return to storage within 24-hrs of your collection day.



Acceptable Trash

- Total weight of can is 100 pounds.
- Some lumber if less than 4 feet in length and bundled weighing not more than 50 pounds. Limit is 3 bundles per year.

Unacceptable Trash

- · Anything over 4 feet in length. Items such as furniture, mattresses, etc. should be disposed of on Large Item Drop-off days (see details on page 2).
- Paint. Partially used cans can be taken to the Household Hazardous Materials facility (see front page for details).
- Construction material (common items include roofing materials, bathtubs, shower enclosures, windows, sheet rock, brick, kitchen cabinets, etc.).
- Hazardous materials such as solvents, gasoline, or other toxic, corrosive, explosive, or highly combustible materials. Some of these items may be taken to the Household Hazardous Materials facility (see front page for details).
- Tires, batteries, and most fluids can be disposed of at an automotive business. (Dry cell batteries are acceptable in regular trash; automotive and other lead-acid batteries are not accepted and have to be recycled.) Some companies charge for disposal, so call in advance.
- Trash bags that contain recycling material. (See recycling instructions.) The waste hauler will tag the bag indicating the violation.





- NO light bulbs, dishes, glassware, window glass, mirrors, or ceramics.
- Remove lids and metal rings, empty, and rinse clean.



TIN CANS: Empty food, paint, aerosol cans only!

- NO chemicals,
- Empty, rinse clean, and remove labels. Ends of cans can stay attached.




ALUMINUM: Cans only!

PLASTIC: Containers/ **Bottles only!**

- NO plastic packaging or Styrofoam.


Milk, juice, broth, soup, and other food & beverage cartons


- What is a carton? It's a type of food and beverage packaging. There are two types: shelf-stable (broth, soup, soy milk, juice, milk, wine) and refrigerated (milk, juice, cream, egg substitutes).
- Drain liquid, rinse clean.

Place glass, tin cans, aluminum cans, plastic, paper, cardboard and cartons together loosely in recycling bin.


NEWSPAPERS/MAGAZINES/CARDBOARD/CHRISTMAS LIGHTS/EXTENSION CORDS

- Junk mail, cardboard and cereal boxes with out liner. NO SHREDDED PAPER.
- Newspapers (including shiny inserts), magazines, and telephone books are acceptable.
- Keep papers as dry as possible! If rain/snow is predicted, please wait until your next recycling week to set out.

Household Hazardous Materials Facility (HHM)

Use is Free for La Crosse County, Wisconsin Residential Users (Unless Otherwise Noted Below)

Acceptable Materials

- Automotive fluids (oil, gas, etc.)
- Batteries (rechargeable, lead acid, lithium)
- Cell phones and digital cameras
- Cleaning products
- Computers (desktops, laptops, tablets)
- Computer equipment (printers, scanners, fax machines, keyboards, speakers, mice, hard drives)
- Fluorescent light bulbs
- Lawn and garden chemicals (pesticides, herbicides, rodenticides, etc.)
- Mercury-containing devices (thermometers, thermostats, etc.)
- Microwaves and small Freon appliances Fees Apply
- Paint, stain, and varnish
- Pool chemicals
- Propane cylinders (handheld only)
- Sharp objects
- TVs and computer monitors Fees Apply
- Video devices (VCRs, DVD players, gaming consoles, cable receivers, etc.)

Unacceptable Materials

- Ammunition
- · Black powder
- Compressed gas cylinders (other than handheld propane)
- Explosives
- Fireworks
- Radioactive materials
- Shock or heat-sensitive materials (peroxide, picric acid, etc.)

SAVE YOURSELF A TRIP!

These items can and should go into your regular curbside trash or recycling:

- Empty paint and aerosol cans (recycle) Alkaline batteries (trash)
- Dried out paint cans (trash)


Residential users with more than 200 lbs. of material are encouraged to schedule an appointment.

Out-of-County residents are welcome to use the HHM on a fee basis.

FREE REUSE ROOM: Over 70,000 lbs. of usable household products are sorted and made available to the public in our ReUse Room annually. All items are free, but donations are appreciated. The ReUse Room is open during regular landfill office hours. The entrance to the ReUse Room is located on the east side of the landfill office building, right across from the HHM.

Safe Transportation of Hazardous Materials

- 1. Never mix chemicals.
- 2. Bring items in original containers or clearly mark contents. Tell attendant if you are unsure what is in a container.
- 3. Tighten all covers and lids.
- 4. Do not load waste materials in passenger area of vehicle.
- Avoid spills. Put waste containers upright in a sturdy container and place securely in the trunk or back of a truck or van. (All boxes or totes will be returned.)

- **6.** If container is leaking, pack it separately in a leak-proof pail or tub.
- 7. Gasoline should be transported in a designated red safety container.
- 8. Motor oil should be transported in a durable and leak-proof container labeled with the words "Used Oil."
- 9. Upon arrival, pull under the HHM canopy and remain in your vehicle with the engine shut off.
- 10. Do not co-mingle batteries with chemical waste. Tape the terminal ends of all batteries with clear tape to prevent arcing.

Sharps & Needles

Needles, syringes, auto-injectors (EpiPens), lancets, razor blades and other sharp objects must be brought to the HHM in puncture-resistant containers. Container options include a red sharps container or an appropriately labeled thick plastic laundry detergent bottle with screw on cap. No other containers will be accepted. Additional sharps collection sites can be found on the WDNR and MPCA websites.

Use By Businesses & Organizations

Many businesses, organizations, farms, orchards, in-home businesses, rental property owners, churches, schools, and municipalities generate small amounts of hazardous waste and are looking for an efficient means to dispose of such materials. Qualifying businesses can utilize the HHM on a fee basis. Prequalification for use is required. Visit our website to complete and submit the required forms.
